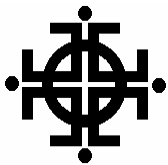

WATCH CLAIRE'S TREE COME TO LIFE!

Based on our theme verse for the year, Claire Bentley has painted an apple tree on the sanctuary wall. You can make it come to life by participating in our Over and Above Stewardship Campaign for outreach to children and families.

- For every 3 hours of combined volunteer time spent in strengthening our ministry to children since the beginning of the year, Claire will add one leaf to the tree. If you have donated any time (such as renovating and improving our facilities, helping out with our special outreach events like Easter and VBS, praying or doing anything to enhance or expand our regular ministries to children and families), then report your hours, or partial hours, by the H on your Home Page any Sunday. Our congregational goal is to contribute at least 1000 hours (333 1/3 leaves) this year.
- For every personal invitation you have extended to a child or a family in the community to participate in one of our regular children's ministries or special events, Claire will add one smiling flower face to the landscape beneath the tree. We want invitations to go out whether or not children attend. If you have done this, put the number of invitations you have extended by the I on your Home Page any Sunday. Our goal is at least 100 personal contacts and invitations (100 flowers) this year.
- For every \$50 in combined contributions for enabling and improving our outreach and ministry to children and their families, Claire will add one apple to the tree. Funds to provide resources beyond our budget for outreach and special ministries to children, and to purchase new audio-visual equipment for Sunday School and Jr. JAMBoree. Use the special envelopes (with the kids' faces) on the credenza to make a contribution in the offering any Sunday. (Please designate checks for the children's ministry and include your name if you wish your contribution to be tax deductible.) Our goal is at least \$5000 (100 apples) this year.
